Cookie Program Troop Goal Setting Worksheet

Girls should discuss what their goal activities will be, then use this worksheet to cost it out and determine an overall goal # of boxes the troop should sell this year. There are 3 parts to every troop's annual cookie goal:

- 1. All troops have basic costs to take care of, such as Membership dues to GSUSA. Troops could also be bridging and need new uniforms and Girls Guide to Girl Scouting, or they will be finishing a Journey and are ready for the next one. Girls are even more engaged in Girl Scouting when they earn their own way. Figure out your basic needs first.
- 2. Set the troop's Service Project goal. What are the girls' interests in helping others? Set a charitable goal, either a fixed # of boxes or an overall percent of all boxes sold. The troop will use these funds to fuel their Service Project.
- 3. Set a common troop goal for fun & learning. How will the troop celebrate their year together? Are they saving towards an international trip in 2 years? What is the plan?

1. Troop Essentials

In some years, the troop only needs their earned awards and some fun patches; other years will be bridging to the next level. Where is your troop? What are their upcoming costs that dues cannot fulfill? Parents are more impressed with Girl Scouting when the girls take charge of the troop's financial needs. Let them show you that they can do it.
