Talk about the people impacted by your project, as well as the project's sustainability and the likelihood of it continuing beyond the current time frame. Please provide proof of your impact, such as numbers, data, evaluations, feedback and photographs.

In 400 words or less, please reflect on your project experience. What was the most successful part? What would you change or do differently if you could start over? What did you learn about yourself? What did you learn about the issue you addressed?

Please submit a video of no longer than two minutes. The video should be casual, fun and all about you and the impact you made! Be sure to include a brief overview of your project, your inspiration, the impact you made and why you should receive the Students Stand #withMalala Scholarship.

Video submission guidelines: Upload your video to Vimeo, YouTube or a file sharing site (such as Dropbox) and give us a link to it (make sure it is not set to private!). The video can be made using any recording device, including a cellphone, tablet or digital camera. Be sure the video is clear in appearance and sound, and that there are no visible or audible background distractions. If your video is recorded on a cell phone, please be sure the phone is held horizontally, as this captures a higher quality video.
