Tournament of Roses® announcement heightens excitement surrounding Girl Scouts' 100th Anniversary Kick-Off at Rose Parade®

LOS ANGELES, NOVEMBER 15, 2011 – When the 2012 Rose Queen and Royal Court were announced last month, the group of young women did not realize that they had already been in a sisterhood together long before being bestowed the Tournament of Roses® honor. As it turns out – all of them were once Girl Scouts.

Newly crowned Rose Queen Drew Washington, 16, and Rose Princesses Morgan Eliza Devaud, 18; Stephanie Grace Hynes, 18; Cynthia Megan Louie, 17; Kimberly Victoria Ostiller, 17; Hanan Bulto Worku, 17; and Sarah Nicole Zuno, 17 are all former Girl Scouts, (Worku is currently), which is quite fitting as the iconic organization kicks off its 100th anniversary year at the upcoming Pasadena Tournament of Roses® Parade on January 2, 2012.

Featured riders will include Girl Scouts from each age level and Girl Scouts Alumnae who are community and business leaders. Furthermore, along with the generous support of float sponsor Union Bank, the float is being funded by Girl Scouts and Girl Scout supporters – making this massive undertaking a bona fide *all-Girl Scout* service project.

With the hope that every flower on the float represents a Girl Scout or friend of Girl Scouting, GSGLA is offering "virtual rides" to Girl Scouts young and old and Girl Scout friends and family for a tax-deductible donation of \$5 each.
