GIRL SCOUTS MOBILIZE AT LOS ANGELES REGIONAL FOOD BANK ON MISSION TO FIGHT HUNGER IN GREATER L.A., MAY 2

Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles teams with Ralphs/Food 4 Less and L.A. Regional Food Bank for annual one-day county-wide service project and food drive

<u>WHAT</u>: In keeping with its goal of encouraging girls to take charge to change their communities for the better, Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles (GSGLA) is teaming up with Ralphs/Food 4 Less and the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank for **Feed Your Neighbor** Food Drive & Service Day on Saturday, May 2.

A recent nationwide food insecurity study found that Los Angeles County has the most hungry families in the nation. Currently, **40 percent of the people served by the L.A. Regional Food Bank and its partner agencies are children**. Local Girl Scouts aim to do something about this.

On Saturday, a new "Service Squad" of Girl Scouts ages 14 and older will mobilize at the L.A. Regional Food Bank in South Los Angeles to pack and sort food to be distributed. Meanwhile, thousands of Girl Scouts of all ages will set up food drive booths in front of Ralphs/Food 4 Less locations to collect food and other items for needy families.
