## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The cookie program is based upon the Girl Scout Promise <u>and</u> Law. Therefore, I have to make sure that I am operating my business in an effective, correct, and productive manner. To help me do this, my Troop Cookie Chair will guide me along the way, but here are some things we both need to know:

- The Cookie Program runs from February 1, 2015 through March 8, 2015; no form of selling can be conducted before or after these dates.
- There are seven varieties of **cookies** which **sell for \$5.00 per box**. There's a gluten free cookie which is a pilot and sells for \$6.00 per box. Sorry, there's a limited supply of this one because it's a pilot, but there's plenty of the other seven varieties.
- Whenever I'm selling cookies, I need to be easily identified as a Girl Scout; therefore, I need to wear my Girl Scout uniform or a Girl Scout shirt. It would be appreciated, but is not required, if adults working with me are dressed in Girl Scout attire as well.
- Guess what? I can set up my own "lemonade stand" in the yard or participate in walkabouts in residential areas; business and commercial districts are for authorized booth sales only. Adult supervision is needed whenever I'm selling cookies.
- Cookie Booth Sales can be held at pre-authorized locations that my Troop Cookie Chair will schedule
  with your help because adequate adult supervision is needed. Only registered Girl Scouts can booth so
  my siblings and friends can't be at the booth with me.
- We need to leave boothing sites cleaner than what we found them. This means we must remove all cookie boxes and anything that we bring to the location. I'm going to make a point of keeping our boothing area clean. After all, it is my place of business!!!
- Yes! Credit cards can be used for Girl Scout cookie purchases, but the credit card reader must be connected/linked to our troop account. No payments can go to an individual or business account-only to our troop checking account. My Troop Cookie Chair has this information.
- The internet can be used for <u>marketing</u> Girl Scout cookies, but not for selling and accepting payment. For example, Facebook can be used to get the word out that I'm selling cookies and to get a promise to buy. However, Amazon, Craigslist and/or PayPal cannot be used to sell and/or accept payments.
- While participating in GSGLA's Cookie Program, I'm learning five essential skills that I can use every daygoal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics. I'm on my journey to success!!!!!

I could be penalized or have one of the following consequences enforced against me or my troop if we are not selling according to the rules and regulations:

- gs Removal of my highest reward level
- gs No future boothing
- **95** Reduction in troop proceeds
- **95** Forfeiture of girl and/or troop proceeds/rewards

## How can you help me have a successful cookie business?

- If necessary, remind me of the above important facts.
- Volunteer to serve as an adult at a cookie booth or help me set up my own lemonade stand in the yard, do a walkabout in our neighborhood, or let me talk with your boss about coming to your place of work to sell my cookies.
- Support my endeavors to reach my personal cookie goal as well as my troop cookie goal.
- Help my Troop Cookie Chair when s/he needs adult assistance.
- If you have questions, please ask my Troop Cookie Chair. This way, my cookie business will definitely be successful.
- I want to be a success, but I need your help!!!!!
- It's my business; I have to sell the cookies, but you can be my trusted assistant!
