Girl Scouts of Greater L.A. inspires thousands of girls at Girltopia: The World of Girl

WHAT: Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles is hosting the country's largest expo just for girls on Nov. 9, 2013. Girltopia: The World of Girl is an all-day event all about exploration, empowerment, and Girl Scout spirit. Roughly 10,000 girls ages 5–18 and their families will converge at the L.A. Convention Center to celebrate girl leadership and have fun learning, creating, and exploring tons of activities related to Girl Scouts' program areas, including leadership, business smarts, environment and outdoor adventure, arts and culture, STEM (science, technology, engineering, math), and wellness and healthy living. Girltopia is also home to a dynamic main stage, an energized SportZone, exciting authors alley, the Barbie® "Be Anything, Do Everything" Experience, Nestlé's Wellville, the BYOU Magazine Celebrity Hotspot, and more. And new this year is Teen Summit @ Girltopia; an awe-inspiring afternoon leadership conference presented by Deloitte just for girls in grades 6 to 12.
