











CHANNELING WING SCOUTS: AVIATION WORKSHOP RECAP

The event was led by the San Fernando Valley Ninety-Nines (SFV 99s)—and they were all so kind, helpful, and more than happy to introduce all of us girls to aviation! I learned that there are so many careers and recreational opportunities for women in aviation, which was really exciting.

At the workshop, we were able to step inside and learn about Anne

Marie Radel's airplane, AKA "The Tiger." She explained to us how aviation works, communications, the rules of the sky, and all about the plane. There were so many different airplanes on the lot, such as low wings and upper wings, each having a different flying experience.

We were also able to go into the control towers and see how everyone's safety and guiders work—at one point, we watched an airplane from the Burbank



Airport be transferred to Whiteman through flashes on the air control screen. The guy in the control tower showed us how they deal with a transfer or a "pass-over," as it was called. We also saw how they help land planes back to back on the runway.

Now, I'm thinking about flying! The Aviation Workshop opened another door of opportunity for not only me, but also the other girls there. Thank you to everyone who made this event happen—and to all the women who showed us their planes. I'm so grateful I had this opportunity.



"DRIVING MY FINANCIAL FUTURE" LAUNCH EVENT EXPERIENCE

Picture this: CEOs, financial service advisors, and financial managers all gathering to teach you personally how to budget, finance, save, and invest.

Talk about a special opportunity! Well, that's just what I was able to experience at the "Driving My Financial Future" launch event at the Toyota Campus in April. And, 26,000 more girls across the country will also be able to gain access to the tools necessary to feel confident in their financial decisions, thanks to this new program.

"Driving My Financial Future" is a program created and sponsored by Toyota Financial Services (TFS) to teach Girl Scouts how to budget, build their credit, research, and comparison shop. Toyota Financial Services recently pledged \$2.1 million to Girl Scouts to help us develop our financial knowledge. Not only was our Greater Los Angeles

CEO, Lise L. Luttgens, at the event, but our national CEO Anna Maria Chávez, was also there for the fun. It was awesome!

Before coming to this event, I had already learned about saving money and budgeting through the Girl Scout Cookie Program. In my Cadette troop, we work toward specific financial goals, right down to the pennies spent on food for trips. This has helped me budget in my personal life by saving for new electronics and budgeting how much I spend on Christmas presents.

"Driving My Financial Future" takes it steps further: At the kick-off event, financial experts from TFS (most of them were Girl Scouts as girls—super inspiring!) helped me along with 140 other Girl Scouts in my area learn how to research and comparison shop. What I discovered: Simply taking the time to investigate my favorite buy on the internet could save me a lot of money! And, I need to remember to check

shipping costs before making my final purchasing decision. We also learned about putting together a monthly budget and the importance of anticipating emergencies. I need to know ways I can save money if in the future I miss work because of these emergencies. And I don't want to ever forget my responsibility to give to charities I believe in—especially Girl Scouts!

The skills I learned at "Driving my Financial Future" will be helpful to all Girl Scouts when we are looking for a car and home or making our college budget. I really liked the fact that the TFS volunteers leading the badge workshops with us were Girl Scouts as girls—it confirmed to me that Girl Scouts definitely builds leaders of tomorrow. The advice they gave us really stuck with me-like keep saving so you can pursue your dreams and help others! Every Girl Scout should get this experience because it is a necessity to our future generations.

TROOP 12815'S **GIRL SCOUT** SILVER AWARD **PROJECT**

The most common question I've received as a Girl Scout for the past two years is, "What's the Silver Award?" As Girl Scouts, most of you know this answer. But just in case, let me tell you: The Girl Scout Silver Award is given when a Girl Scout troop works on a specific Take Action project for at least 50 hours. It is the highest award a Cadette can earn.

My troop, Troop 12815, worked on protecting and saving our oceans. The oceans are in danger because of all the plastic we use and put in it. The oceans aren't the only things in danger, either. The animals that live in it are and so are we.





For our project, we decided to promote less plastic usage in our Palisades community and greater Los Angeles. At public venues, we delivered a presentation showing people the dangers of plastics and handed out reusable bags made out of old T-shirts to the listeners. We also used a PowerPoint presentation to drive home the issue.

Has the world been saved yet? Not quite. But to celebrate the work we've done so far, we received our Silver Award in a special ceremony. Each girl in my troop was recognized and received a certificate from Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti, California Senator Diane Feinstein, US Congressman Ted Lieu, and U.S. President Barack Obama.

My troop would like to encourage you to make a difference in reducing plastic pollution, too. Be creative and don't be careless with how you use plastic. Better yet-don't use it at all.

Be a role model and deepen your understanding of leadership development! Program aides guide younger girls to be leaders in their own lives and in the world. The training helps girls gain skills needed to work with younger girls, peers, and adult volunteers. Program aides may put their skills into practice at council programs, summer programs, and at troop- and service unit-led events. This training is a prerequisite for all Cadettes wishing to complete the Program Aide Award. It is recommended that girls complete the Leader in Action (LiA) during sixth grade and attend the PA training in seventh grade. Note: Summer camp aides have additional requirements. Five Minutes With...



2015 GIRL SCOUT GOLD AWARDEE

What did you do for your Gold Award project?

I worked alongside Peggy Nguyen and her team at Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA) as well as the advisory board that I created called Friends of the LAX Dunes (FOLD) to help restore the previously neglected LAX Coastal Dunes. I organized three volunteer days that were sponsored by local corporations, and with the help of more than 65 volunteers, we helped remove the non-native plants located on the dunes to make room for the incoming native plants.

What was your biggest "take-away" from working on your project?

I learned how to be an effective leader. I had to make my event exciting, and I needed to be friendly and relatable so that people would listen and participate. I also learned that it is important to plan ahead!

What was your proudest moment working on your Gold Award?

Definitely the last volunteer day when more than 30 volunteers joined us in removing almost 80 bags of non-native plants. It was our most successful event and some people even described it as one of the best community service events they had ever been to because they were able to be see the difference they were making in their community. I was also interviewed by KABC and our volunteer day was featured on the evening news.

What advice do you have for a girl just starting on her Gold Award journey?

Start early! The earlier you start, the easier it is to find solutions to obstacles. Also, pick a project and an issue that you are passionate about. If you choose something that you love, it will make the Gold Award even more fun to work on than it already is.

What makes a Gold Award project stand out?

When you can truly see the growth in a girl. I smile when I see girls overcome hurdles and handle situations outside their comfort zones, ending up with projects that are fulfilling to all involved.

What does "sustainability" mean?

The Gold Award workbook states: "You must make arrangements (such as collaborating with community leaders and/or organizations; building alliances with mentors, etc.) to ensure that the project creates lasting change and is not a one-time event." Start with what you want people to remember from the project. How can you leave your "stamp" on it for the world to remember? Do you want people to continue passing on the message?

What is your favorite thing about being on the Gold Award committee?

Working with girls, Gold Award volunteers, and staff. I enjoy having discussions about proposals or final reports, sharing opinions, and coming to conclusions. I love guiding girls as they pursue their goals and working with them as they formulate projects and tackle problems. Most of all, I love watching the girls become confident, responsible young women ready to take on the world!

What advice do you have for a girl considering Going Gold?

Don't wait! Start early and get your prerequisite Journey done. Teens are busy these days, but taking the time to Go Gold has many rewards beyond looking good on college applications. Girls acquire skills to help them navigate life in college and beyond. How many women who may someday lead our nation have earned the Gold Award?




