TODAY: GIRL SCOUTS WELCOME HOME BELOVED TROOP LEADER FROM AFGHANISTAN Longtime Girl Scout Volunteer and U.S. Army Capt. Dannielle Carroll to be greeted by cheering Girl Scouts after year-long deployment overseas

WHAT: Today (Wednesday, Sept. 18) Girl Scout Troop Leader and U.S. Army Capt. Dannielle Carroll will arrive home after being deployed for a year in Afghanistan—and the first people to greet her as she exits the bus will be her Girl Scout family. Inspired by Capt. Carroll, her Girl Scout troop sent her letters and video messages while she was away. Before her deployment, she was a troop leader and key Girl Scout volunteer in Santa Monica for 10 years. Despite having no children of her own, Capt. Carroll is proud to volunteer for Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles and to give back to the community and to the organization that she holds dear to her heart. In Afghanistan, her commitment to service persisted as she worked with Afghan children in their schools.

FACTS:

- A member of Girl Scouts since becoming a Brownie in 1986, Capt. Dannielle Carroll has served as a leader for the past 12 years, both in the Santa Monica Bay area and in Kentucky. She was stationed in Kabul, Afghanistan for a year with the U.S. Army.
- In 2012, days before her deployment Capt. Carroll was awarded the Leader with a Heart honor from Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles. This award is given to a leader by parents and girls in the troop who believe the volunteer to be outstanding in program delivery and troop leadership.
- The girls in Capt. Carroll's Santa Monica Girl Scout troop sent her packages and video messages throughout her deployment and are eager to welcome her home.
