

Property Name: Skyland Ranch



Skyland Ranch is an outdoor camp circa 1950 nestled in the San Jacinto Mountains adjacent to the San Bernardino Forest. The camp consists of 195 acres of grounds at an elevation of 5,100 feet. The site includes several single story wood frame structures, Duncan Lodge (w/kitchen facilities), Wishhaven Lodge (w/limited cooking facilities), an infirmary, barn, Fairfield Cabin, Willowdale Cabin, and (5) small cabins (sleep 8 each) with wood stoves. There is a modern ADA compliant restroom unit with showers. The Circle Ho outdoor unit includes 6 sleeping shelters accommodating up to 28 campers with one bathroom with three pit toilets and showers.

The camp is used for troop camping year-round and during summer months by a devoted group of volunteers who enjoy hiking along the adjacent Pacific Crest Trail. In addition, GSGLA offers one week of resident camp during the summer.
