FOLLOW THE STEPS OUTLINED BELOW.

Step one:

Identify an energy conservation issue in your neighborhood, community, city and/or town

- Does energy come from clean, renewable sources?
- How is energy used for transportation?
- How is energy used in public spaces roads, parks, libraries, schools?
- Earth Hour March 26th 2011
- Recycling facilities for appliances or electronics
- How do you use energy at home?

Suggestions:

• Initiate a door to door campaign your troop can do in your neighborhood.

• Create a presentation about your water issue and to show people why it is important, and how they can help!

Step five:

Report to the council (dmoore@girlscoutsla.org) the results of your efforts. Please see the report form on the Take Action & Forever Green link on the website. The deadline is **April 30, 2011**.

Step six:

Celebrate your success!
