Step one:

Identify a water issue in your neighborhood, community, city and/or town

- The effects of water quality & storm water
- Prevention of storm water pollution
- Rain gardens
- Disposal of hazardous household waste
- Watering lawns & waste water
- Quality of lakes, rivers & ponds
- Water monitoring
- River Clean-ups

Research how you can make a difference in your area of concern. Sign up for programs at local environmental community groups and learn more online.



Step three:

Invite others to support and take action with you:

Step four:

TAKE ACTION

Suggestions:

- Create a door to door campaign your troop can do in your neighborhood.
- Make a presentation to your class or school about your water issue and tell them how they can also make a difference.

Step five:

Report to the council the results of your efforts. Please see the report form on the Take Action & Forever Green link on the website. The deadline is **April 30, 2011**.

FINAL RESULTS: Submit your project results to dmoore@girlscoutsla.org. Your report should include:

- Leader's name(s) & email(s)
- Troop number
- Service unit name/number
- Program level
- Names of Girl Scouts participating
- What issue was addressed
- How many people were engaged
- Hours spent
- How you might keep the project going.
