Front Satellite Unit: Girl Scouts of all six levels proudly ride this floral tribute to 100 years of Girl Scouting. The theme, "What Will You Do Today?" is answered on the main float by a representation of unlimited girl opportunities.

Book and Pearls: honors the Girl Scouts history and founder, Juliette "Daisy" Gordon Low. The pearls represent the pearls she sold to fund the first Girl Scout troops.

High-flying, High Achieving Girl Scout: wearing a badge/patch-filled sash, she symbolizes curiosity, exploration and propelling the Girl Scout movement into the future.

Yellow Roses: signifies the importance of friendship throughout the life of a Girl Scout.

Pot of Cookies at the end of the Rainbow: represents the variety of skills learned through the Girl Scout Cookie Program, the nation's largest business/financial literacy program for girls.

Tall ship, Car, Robotic Space Rover: symbolizes adventure, discovery, travel and the many experiences that Girl Scouting offers through STEM, outdoor & environment, healthy living and arts & culture programs.
