For Whom: Brownie Girl Scouts

Timing: May be earned once and completed in the time

required by the girls.

Purpose: To help girls appreciate the sky above them.

Recognition: The Try-It may be purchased in the council shop.

Placement: May be worn on the badge sash/vest along with

other official badges.

Requirements: Complete four (4) of the activities listed.

Supplies Needed:

- black construction paper
- gummy stars
- notebook paper
- chalk
- star map
- telescope

Activities:

- 1. Make your own constellation:
 - a. Explain to the girls that they are making their own dot-to-dot constellation. It may be helpful to show them an example.
 - b. Place six to eight gummy stars on the black construction paper
 - c. Draw the connecting line between the stars to create a picture of an object like an apple or a cat.
- 2. Find the North Star:
 - a. Find the Little Dipper (It is the one with the backwards handle.)
 - b. The North Star is the last star at the tip of the handle. It always points to the north.
 - c. Do you know its other name? It is also called Polaris.
- 3. Your constellation:
 - a. Look at a star map and find a constellation that could be seen on your birthday.
- 4. What does it look like?:
 - a. Choose a constellation that you do not know and describe it. What does it look like to you?
- 5. Moon gazing:
 - a. Look at the moon through a telescope.
 - b. Tell someone what it looks like. Does it look like cheese?
- 6. Story time:
 - a. Listen to a folk-story explaining what is in the sky or how it got there.
 - b. Draw a picture for the story you listened to.
